Liberty: Individual self-determination against the abuse of institutional power.

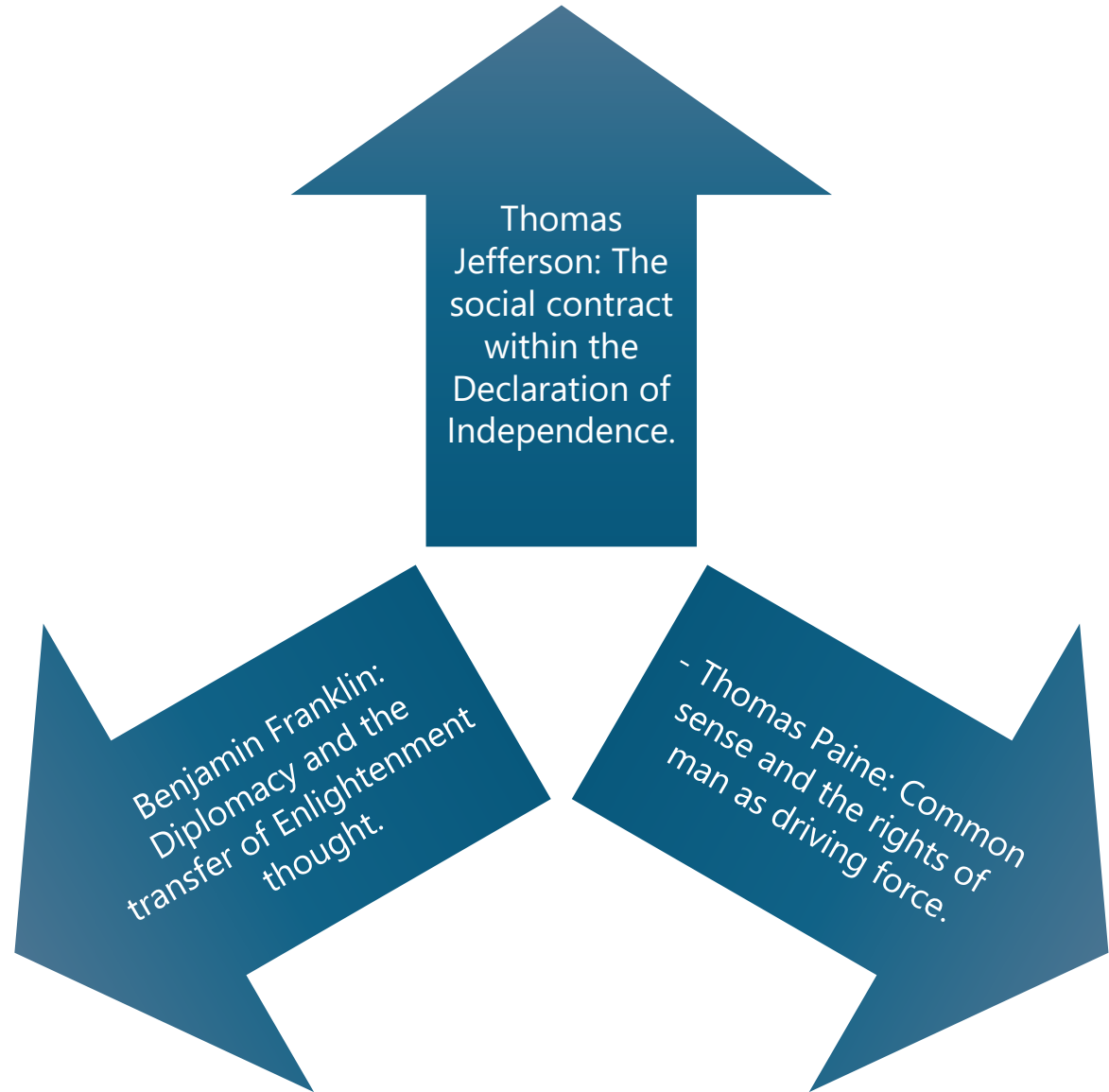


Equality: An inalienable right to legal justice without privileges of birth.
